STATE OF WISCONSIN VETERANS MEMORIAL CEMETERY
PRE-REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Please note that pre-registering with a Wisconsin State Veterans Cemetery is not required for interment. Eligibility may also be determined at the time of need.

VETERAN ELIGIBILITY: Burial is based on a veteran meeting military service and Wisconsin residency requirements.

Military service requirement for burial in Wisconsin State Veterans Cemeteries must be in accordance with the eligibility standards as set by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs – National Cemetery Administration, and as a minimum must meet one of the following:

- Veteran was discharged from “active duty” under other than dishonorable conditions, or
- Veteran died while on “active duty”, or
- Veteran served at least 20 years in the National Guard or Reserves and qualified for military retirement pay (or would have qualified except death occurred before age 60).

Wisconsin state residency requirement for burial in state veteran cemeteries must meet one of the following:

- Veteran was a Wisconsin resident at the time of entry or re-entry into military service, or
- Veteran was a Wisconsin resident for at least 12 consecutive months after entering or reentering service on “active duty”, or
- Veteran was a Wisconsin resident at the time of death.

Note: There is no residency requirement for a veteran who dies while on “active duty”.

ELIGIBILITY FOR A VETERAN’S IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBERS

Spouses, surviving spouse, and dependent children are eligible for interment even if the veteran is not buried or memorialized in a state veteran’s cemetery and the veteran would have met both military service and Wisconsin residency requirements. This includes, lost or buried at sea, missing or missing in action, or whose remains have been donated to science or cremated and the cremated remains scattered.

Eligibility Includes:

- Surviving spouse of an eligible veteran that has been interred who remarries retains his or her eligibility for burial.
- Any natural or adoptive child of an eligible veteran who are under the age of 18 years or who are under 26 years of age and pursuing a course of instruction at an approved educational institution.
- An adult child of an eligible veteran of any age if the child is physically or mentally disabled and incapable of self-support by reason of mental or physical disability.

DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR PRE-REGISTRATION:

1. **Veteran** - Military discharge (DD Form 214) or other type of acceptable discharge document.
 - a. **Proof of Residency** *—required only if your discharge does not show your home of record at time of entry into active service as Wisconsin.*
 - Provide a copy of a Wisconsin income tax return (WI tax Form 1 or 1A)
 - For homeowners, copy of real estate tax bill listing veteran as an owner (must be a primary residence not a vacation home)
 - For renters, a copy of a completed lease totaling 12 months
 - WI driver's license or WI ID issued 2008 to 12 months prior to application.
If are unable to provide one of the suggestions above, contact the office for other acceptable documents.
2. **Spouse** - Copy of a legal marriage certificate.
3. **Dependent Child** - Copy of a birth certificate or legal adoption papers. Medical documentation outlining the nature of the child's disability. Upon review of the initial information given you may be asked to provide additional information.
4. If a Power of Attorney is pre-registering and signing the application on behalf of the veteran, you must provide a copy of your POA.
5. If a surviving spouse is pre-registering for a deceased spouse, please provide a copy of the death certificate.

INTERMENT OPTIONS:

The cemetery can inter caskets and cremation urns. Caskets are in-ground only. Cremated remains may be interred either in-ground within the cremation urn garden, above ground in the columbarium, or in the scattering garden.

BURIAL ITEMS PROVIDED:

- Burial Space** - Next available; no pre-selection, one space per veteran
- Lawn crypt** - Concrete liner for casket interments (double depth for Veteran/Spouse)
- Marker** - Upright granite for casket burials and newer cremation urn garden sections
- Flush granite for cremated remains in older urn garden sections (in-ground)
 - Bronze Niche Plaque or Granite Niche Cover – for cremated remains in columbarium (above ground)
 - Bronze Niche Memorial Plaque – for cremains in scattering garden

BURIAL FEES:

Fees are subject to change & cannot be pre-paid

There is no charge for burial of an eligible veteran with use of burial items supplied by the cemetery. A fee applies for a non-veteran spouse or dependent child of an eligible veteran. Please contact the cemetery for current information regarding these fees or check the Department's website at:

All Wisconsin state veteran cemeteries accept outside dealer vaults for casket remains. Additional fees apply when a family decides to have their own vault placed at the cemetery versus using the liner already provided. This additional fee currently applies only to the cemeteries at Spooner and Union Grove.
