

From Delivery Driver to Nurse

George Hamilton is a very familiar face at the Veterans Home at Union Grove. He is around a lot – picking up extra shifts and helping on holidays. So, you might not guess that he has not always worked at Union Grove. In fact, George spent a big part of his early career doing a completely different kind of work – for 21 years, he delivered Wonder Bread to stores. A job that, he says, he pursued after the birth of his first child, simply to "pay the bills."

But when Wonder Bread went out of business in November 2012, George had the opportunity to go back to school with support from the federal Trade Adjustment Assistance program. That is when he chose a nursing career and has been at Union Grove for 3 years. A typical day as a nurse, he says, is about so much more than getting medicine and taking vitals.

"It's about really taking care of the Members. I've always been super connected to the people I take care of and their families," he said. "You hear their stories, and you build more of a personal relationship. One thing that's nice with long-term care is that you're usually taking care of a person for an extended period and you get to build a relationship with them."

George says he tries to bring a sense of joy to the community and that he likes to "keep the place a little lighter and a little happier," humming in the halls or breaking out in song. He doesn't claim to be a superstar singer, but with eight kids at home, ranging in age from one to 29, he does have an expansive repertoire: "I can sing a country song, or I can sing a Ludacris song. I can go from Barney one minute, to Def Leppard the next. You name it, I've heard it and I can remember part of it."

He says that one of the things he appreciates most about working here is the community, from the volunteers who come in to help run activities and staff the deli (prior to COVID) to the camaraderie of his colleagues. One of his fondest memories is the 100th birthday party held for his grandmother, who was a Member of Union Grove for nine months, where his work family and his biological family celebrated together.
