The Wedding at Cana

(John 2: 3ff) "...They have no wine. Do whatever he tells you...." The intervention of Mary at this social gathering is in itself a witness to her role in the Church. 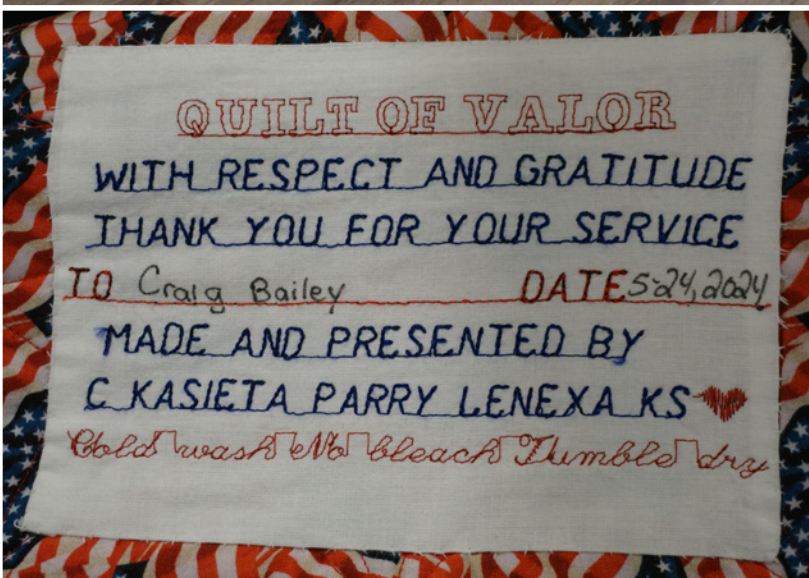

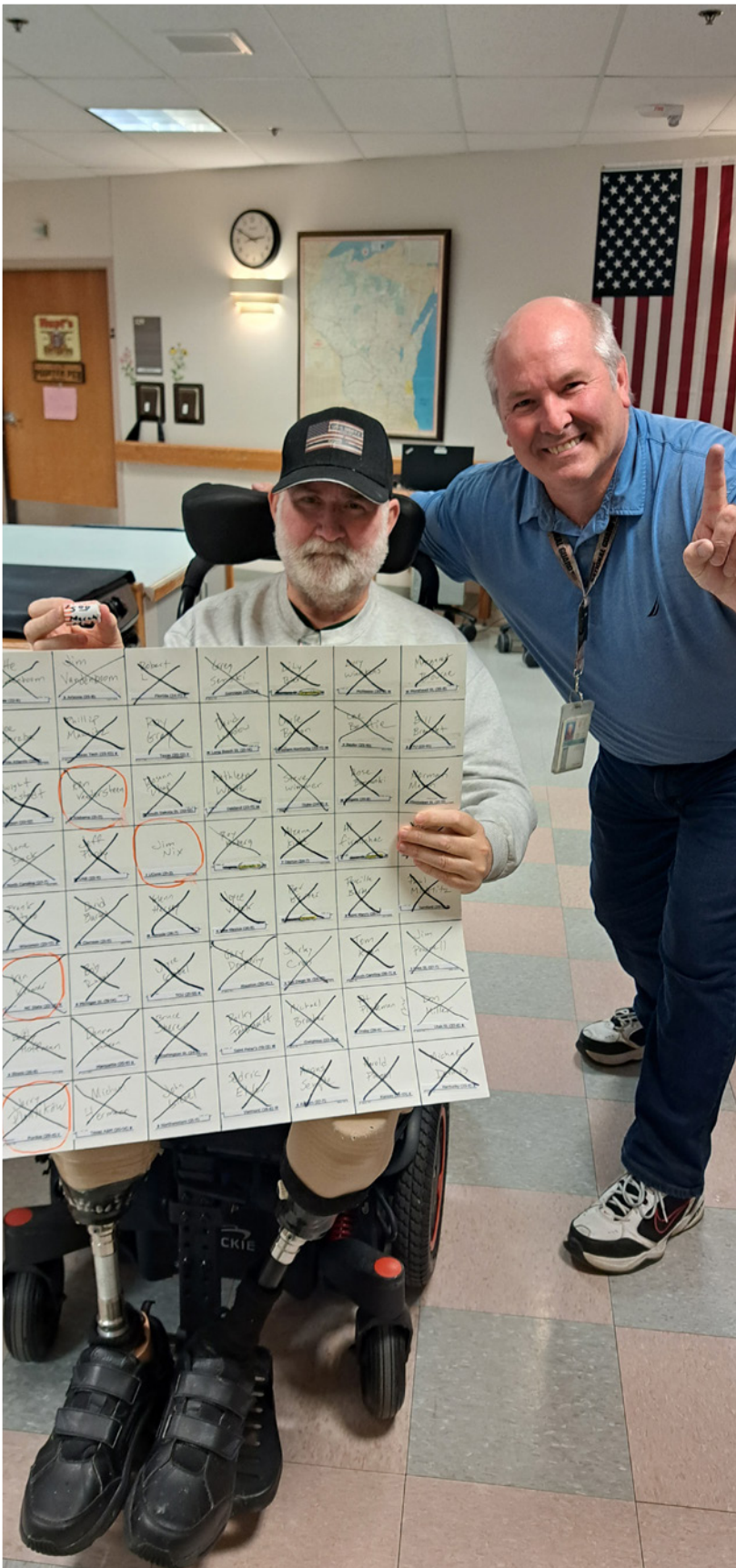

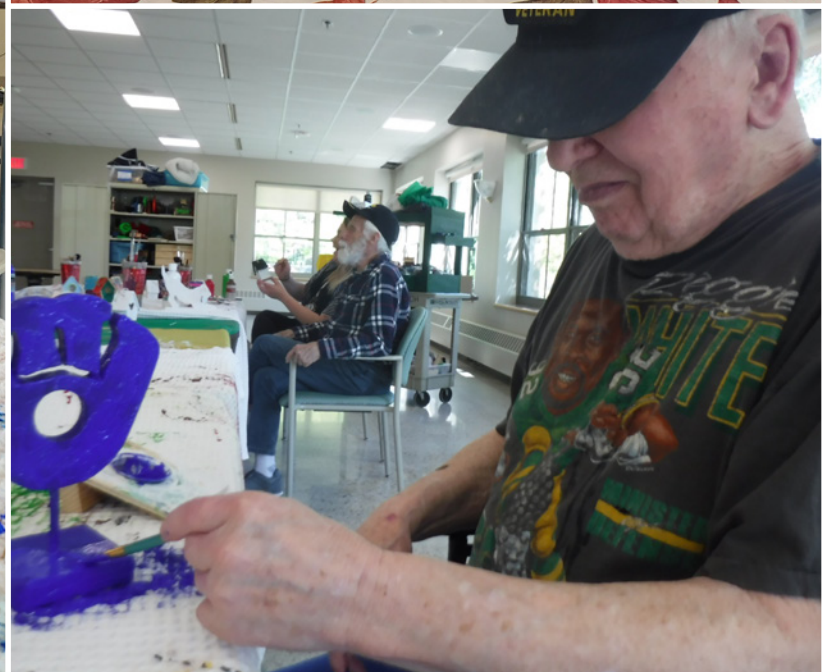
