

EMPLOYEE HIGHLIGHT — DEANNA


Meet Deanna, this month's employee highlight for the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union Grove!

DEMENTIA LIVE

UGVA has been working on an initiative to educate staff on the best dementia care practices. While partnering with Greenfield Rehabilitation UGVA hosted Michelle Strege MS/CCC-SLP CADDCT-CDP, Director of Sales and Marketing/Recruiter to train 12 staff on August 13th by taking the Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia Care Seminar. The curriculum was provided by the National Council of Certified Dementia Practitioners. Since completing this class, staff have the option to achieve status as a Certified Dementia Practitioner with support from Union Grove Veterans Home. Staff hold this certification with an option to renew after two years. More classes will be scheduled in the near future to educate more staff. Staff were excited to participate in this class and could be heard sharing things they learned with others the next day.

UGVA also partned with the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Racine County to provide Dementia Live on August 27th for staff and families. This was a unique inside-out understanding of dementia as well as the aging process. Participants gained a heightened awareness of the challenges associated with living with dementia and left with valuable tips and tools to improve communication and connection. Staff at the VA will continue to offer the Virtual Dementia Tour periodically after this initial event.
